

WNYLRC staff attended the community unveiling of a newly digitized collection at the **Frank E. Merriweather**, **Jr. Branch Library** (*Buffalo & Erie County Library System*) on Wednesday, September 13 at 2:00 pm. Also in attendance were members of the *Buffalo Genealogical Society of the African Diaspora* (BGSAD). The Merriweather Branch library houses a physical collection of funeral programs (maintained by BGSAD) from African American churches in the city of Buffalo. This is an important piece of history that was recently digitized to make this collection more accessible to the community. The project was made possible thanks in part to a grant from the Institute for Museum and Library Services as part of the ConsidertheSourceNY.org Diversity and Collaborative Knowledge Program. Ron Gaczewski, Digital Production, Preservation and Annex Operations Strategist at the *State University of New York at Buffalo*, contributed his digitization skills to the project. Digital Equity: On September 28, New York State released its 5-Year Broadband Equity and Deployment (BEAD) Program Action Plan to the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA). 




This collection is comprised of glass plate lantern negatives, taken during the late 19th and early 20th centuries. At the time this slide was taken, the Armory of the 74th Regiment located on Connecticut Street was fairly new. Designed by Isaac G. Perry, it was built entirely of Medina sandstone. This historic, intimidating structure is still in use by the National Guard's 74th Regiment today. Members of the National Guard stayed here during past year's severe winter storm so they could readily offer emergency response services to those who needed immediate assistance.
